



PUBLIC PARTICIPATION <u>BEFORE</u> THE EUROPEAN WATER FRAMEWORK DIRECTIVE

- The EBRO RIVER BASIN ORGANIZATION was created in 1926 as a new way to manage water with a "basin approach" and with the participation of water users.
- Since 1985, under the Spanish Water Act, there are several participatory bodies in the Ebro RBO, where users, authorities (national, regional and local) and other organizations take part.
- Water users communities have a traditional and legal participatory role.




2.- District meetings with groups of stakeholders
