

## The Consultation Mechanism

1999: Initiation of talks on a regional institutional framework

2005: Ministerial declaration on the consultation mechanism


2007: - Agreement on the structure, operation & funding modalities

- Ownership & accountability by the three countries

- Coordination Unit (CU) hosted by OSS

2008: - Establishment of the CU





A 3 step process for cooperation in the management of transboundary aquifers




### Lessons learned
