This publication, like the previous INBO handbooks on Integrated Water Resources Management (IWRM) in 2009 and 2012, will be based on practical experience and knowhow gained in basins worldwide. The publication will complement the 2009 UNECE Guidance on Water and Adaptation to Climate Change.

Prepared initially in English and French, this publication will be presented at the 7th World Water Forum in Daegu, Republic of Korea, in April 2015.

A Drafting Group has been created in December 2013 in order to facilitate the elaboration of this publication.

To meet the objective, the UNECE and the INBO invite you to contribute in this work, in particular for providing relevant case studies on the adaptation to climate change in your basins, according the following topics:

- The formal and informal arrangements to put in place
- The application of IWRM principles
- The information and data needed
- The vulnerability and impact assessments
- The measures to implement and prioritisation
- The economic and financial matters
- The evaluation of adaptation strategies
- The capacity building
- The communication and the involvement of stakeholders.

The aim is to finalise the publication in January 2015.
